What We're Learning this Month

Reading: We are digging deeper into fiction texts, nonfiction texts, and poetry this month. We will continue to be working on comprehension strategies and decoding words as well.

Math: We are finishing our last math unit that is an extension of the concepts that we have learned so far this year. This unit will include addition and subtraction story problems, partner numbers, teen numbers, comparing numbers, and addition and subtraction skills. Students will also learn measurement skills in this unit.

Writing: We are going to be finishing up our personal narrative unit. We will be working on making sure their writing has enough details in the beginning, middle, and end to make it exciting for the reader. We will also be working on using capital letters when needed and spaces between words.

Science/Social Studies: We are also starting our last science unit. Students will be learning about the physical characteristics of plants and animals.



Reading Each Night and This Summer

Please make sure you are reading and practicing trick words with your child each night to help them continue to develop their reading skills! In class, we are continuing to work on tapping out words and comprehending what we are reading. It is very important that they are practicing reading and practicing their trick words each night.
